# The Tablet *of Honor*



The Kiwanis International Foundation's  
highest level of recognition.





The Tablet of Honor was established in 1967 as a means to honor deserving individuals, Kiwanis clubs, divisions, districts, or organizations that have exemplified dedicated service to Kiwanis, their club, or community. The Tablet of Honor is a vehicle through which individuals or groups memorialize Kiwanis leaders, spouses, or friends, and as a means to honor a spouse on the anniversary of a special occasion. Tablet of Honor contributions can be made on behalf of an individual or an entity such as a club, corporation, or organization. Individuals cannot, however, honor themselves.



The purpose of the Tablet of Honor is to recognize someone special who has dedicated his or her life to supporting Kiwanis activities. Contributions to recognize such devotion to Kiwanis help fulfill the mission of the Kiwanis International Foundation: "To assist Kiwanis International in serving the children of the world."

Recipients are presented an attractive walnut and bronze wall plaque signifying that a minimum contribution of US \$2,000 was made in their name. In addition, the recipient receives a tie tack/lapel pin, and a pocket crest. The first recipient in a Kiwanis club is also presented with a smaller version of the pocket crest for placement on the club's award banner. Each recipient is given a patch bearing his or her name to be displayed beneath the Tablet of Honor Crest on the club's award banner.

The Tablet of Honor contribution is placed in the Kiwanis International Foundation's endowment fund, where only the earnings are used to provide grants in support of Kiwanis-sponsored programs, disaster relief, the Kiwanis International Worldwide Service Project, and children worldwide.
